M.L. Schultze retired from WKSU in the summer of 2018 but has continued her 40 years in journalism with freelance reporting and editing on elections, education and criminal and social justice. She came to WKSU as news director in July 2007 after 25 years at The Repository in Canton, where she was managing editor for nearly a decade. At her retirement, she was the digital editor at WKSU as well as being named the best radio reporter in Ohio by the Society of Professional Journalists. She's also been an analyst who has appeared on NPR, Here and Now, the TakeAway, and C-SPAN as well as being a regular panelist on Ideas, WVIZ public television's reporter roundtable.

A native of Philadelphia, Pa., Schultze graduated from Syracuse University with a degree in magazine journalism and political science. She lives in Canton with her husband, Rick Senften, the retired special projects editor at The Repository. They have two children and three grandchildren.
